The Book of Crimean legends, which was published in Romania in the time of occupation of Crimea, is interesting for cultural studies research because this is a visual example of re-writing of history and mythologization of real events. The author of the book who was from the occupant army and was writing about Crimean folklore deliberately changed some details. This article is about analysis of these changes. For the research is also important to analyze introductions to the book by a Romanian writer N.Bozariya and by the author of the book I. Georgescu-Arvatu. Their thinking about Crimean history and culture showed official Romanian attitude towards Russia and Crimea in that times when the book was published. Obvious suspicions about Russians, sympathy towards Crimean Tatars and the attempt to show that Crimean culture is based on Greek and Roman culture are seen in the book. Religious factor is no less important. The author is very careful with Islamic legends; he chose mostly Christian religious legends. The most important was to find new texts of unknown Crimean legends.
